



What are excess deaths?

In any given week you expect a level of deaths as sadly each and every day individuals die. Excess deaths are the number of deaths over and above the average for the time of the year.

The blue line on the chart shows the average number of deaths per week in any given week of the year, averaged over the period 2015 to 2019. The orange line shows the total deaths in England and Wales in each week of 2020.

Up to the **22 May 2020**, estimate 65,030 excess deaths (above average) related to the Covid-19 pandemic in the UK. Excess deaths down for the sixth week in a row up to 22 May 2020, peaking around 08 April 2020
